Everyone agreed that Minnie was right.

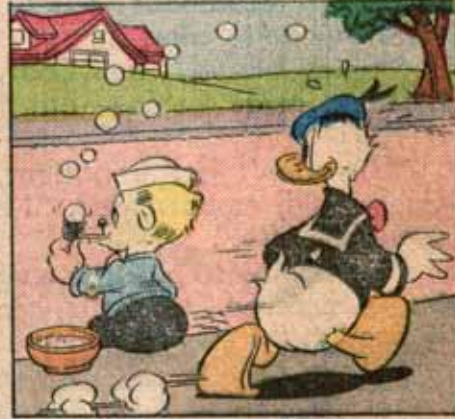
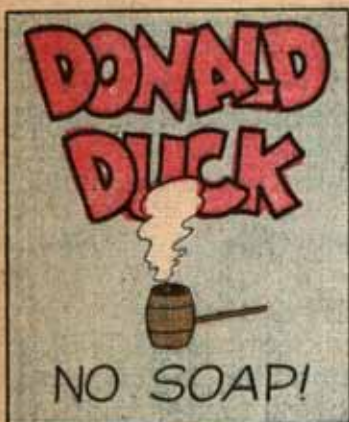
Goofy held out his hand to get the box of candy that Mickey was giving him.

"I suppose that's part of the stunt?" said Mickey slyly, looking at Goofy's throbbing, swollen finger. "Anyway, it's a good trick."

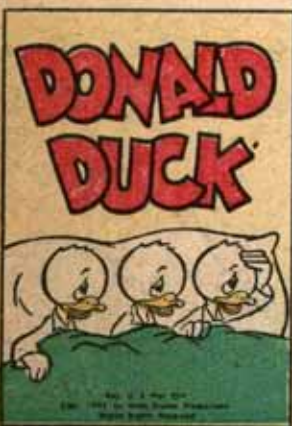
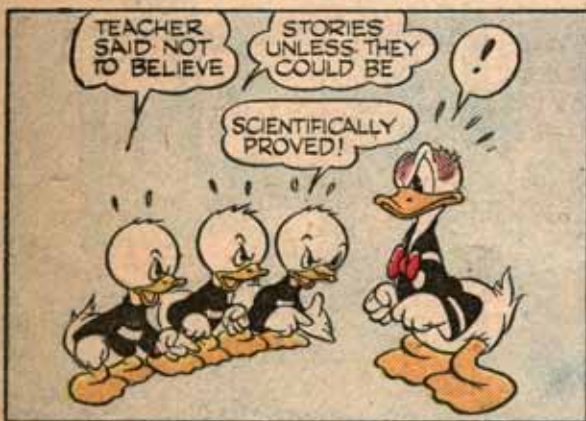
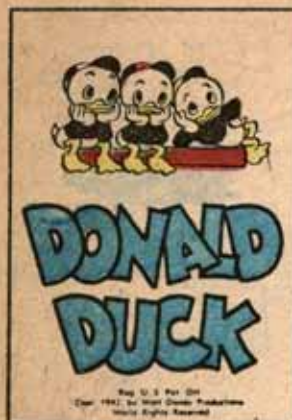
